


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SECOND LEVEL MASTER OF ARTS

CONTEMPORARY MUSIC INTERPRETATION

Academic Year 2020/2021

Educational objectives

The main goal of this course is the acquisition of the technical and theoretical competencies necessary to specialize in the repertoire of contemporary music. The M.A. is a high level study plan, oriented toward a specific area of the interpretation and production of contemporary music. The objective of the course is to create international musicians at a professional level with expert knowledge and skills in the interpretation and performance of contemporary music for soloists or ensembles.

Study plan

The Master's study plan is divided into individual, group and collective lessons. The Master's lessons will start in November 2020 for a total duration of 407 hours (including class lessons, attendance at workshop and internships, and education and orientation apprenticeships).

Required qualifications for the admission test

A Conservatory diploma, and a high school diploma or any other equivalent title; a Second level academic diploma from a Conservatory of Music or an IMP institution that grants equivalent qualifications; a Second level academic diploma from some other AFAM institution or any other qualifications obtained abroad, accepted under the present legislation. Foreign students are admitted to the course with a valid diploma equivalent to a Bachelor's plus Master's degree.

Admission

Performance test, oral test and curriculum evaluation.
